King Charles III Coronation Medal



Information pertaining to the subject medal can be gleaned from <u>Her Excellency the Governor General's website here</u>, at this link.

The announcement broke early (3:15 am) this morning on social media (Facebook).

The RCAF Association is not repeat not one of the many partnership organizations, and an early reply from the Governor General's office is that the government of Canada's selection (of partners) process is now closed.



Queries have been sent to Senator Pamela Wallin's office and to the Minister of Veterans' Affairs office, asking why the RCAF Association may have been overlooked and if we could possibly appeal the decision. I have also sent a query to the Governor General's office responsible for our (long-standing) request for royal patronage following the death of our late patron Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

A reply has been received from the Governor General's office through Senator Wallin's office that we may have been overlooked because we are a member organization of the National Coalition of Veterans' Associations (NCVA).

I called the NCVA this morning and spoke to Susan Trimble, who was unaware an official announcement had been made by the Governor General's office (on social media).

Nevertheless, Susan indicated the NCVA anticipates the possibility of an allocation of 175 medals to be apportioned to the NCVA member associations. This apportionment may repeat may be done "per capita" meaning the allocation of medals to each organization will reflect their membership at the time the allocation is made.

There are approximately 68 member associations to the NCVA of which 13 are designated "legacy" associations, meaning they are no longer active, there are no members to speak of and/or there are no contacts for the associations. This leaves as many as 55 "active" associations for which the NCVA has contact information. Susan advised when she learns how the nomination process may work she will likely share appropriate information with those on the NCVA contact list, including the RCAF Association.

Prairie Group Annual Report 2023-24 Year

Well, this year continues to be a very slow one even for Prairie Group. It all started with the COVID-19 pandemic four years ago when we all had to stay home with no visiting or group meetings. All Wings in Prairie Group shut down and Saskatoon closed their doors. All wings were back in operation to a certain degree last year even though on a reduced schedule. Other than 600 Wing I have not done my annual visits to each of the wings and visit with old and new friends. National has kept busy through virtual meetings and online messages.

Terry Chester, our National Chair for the past number of years, has done an incredible job along with Dean Black keeping everyone informed. Late last year an online election was held for the National Board of Directors. Last month we were all officially sworn into office. Terry Chester advised that he would like to give up the office of Chair as he has been in that position long past his original mandate. We then held a vote amongst the BOD and elected Charles (Chuck) Lovallo as our Chairman of the Board and Terry Chester as our Vice-Chair. With some new faces and ideas on the board I think it will be an interesting time ahead. Our first official tasking will be 'Air Force of the Hill' set for June 11th when the BOD will meet with members of parliament, other aviation partners where we will promote the RCAFA and in general make them aware of what we do for the country, veterans and our youth. I have attached a poster of the event and if you happen to be in Ottawa on June 11th let Dean Black know and rub shoulder with the other half.

Unfortunately, each Wing in Prairie Group continued to lose members this past year and National is working on a revised membership enrollment form and membership recruiting/retention ideas. More on this will be out shortly.

AS I indicated in last year's report the Association has implemented a job board on the web site. Any company in the aviation field can post a job through Dean Black and the board is open to anyone wishing to apply. For any applicant that is hired the company pays the RCAFA a fee. Members are encouraged to check the National Web site to keep up to date on what is happening within our group.

Last year I planned on having a in person AGM in Regina at the Regina Flying Club. The cost was way down from previous years, only \$5.00 registration and \$20 for lunch/coffee break and we went to an informal dress code to try and get more to attend. Unfortunately, even these measures did not work and after only 5 applications were received, I cancelled. This year I looked at doing the same thing but got very little response, so I decided to not hold one. 600 Wing executive submitted a resolution to dissolve Prairie group and 500 Wing seconded the resolution. I reviewed it and thought it had merit, so I then forwarded it to National for consideration as they must approve the dissolution of a group. They reviewed it and made some suggestions as to content. 500 Wing then submitted a new resolution which is now under consideration by all Prairie Group wings. More to follow.
